Europe (Communication and Language)

- A: Take a Spring walk. What changes can you see are happening around you?
- B: Ask each member of your family what their favourite minibeast is and why. Record their answers.

North America (Personal Social Emotional Development)

- A: Practise getting yourself dressed and undressed, turning clothes the right way if they are inside out.
- B: Now it is getting warmer outside, try a new physical activity. Maybe something you haven't done before. What did you try? Did you like it?

Asia (Physical Development)

- A: Using playdough, can you make your own minibeast. You can design your own to make or recreate your favourite.
- B: Move like a Minibeast! Choose your favourite minibeast and think about how it moves. Take a video of you being the minibeast – can you climb over, under, through different obstacles.

Reception Our Garden

Over the next two half terms, we will be reading about all types of plants and flowers, as well as different insects and what makes them special. We will also be exploring the outdoors to see what kind of creatures live in our outdoor area, as well as planting our own seeds.

Antarctica (Understanding of the World)

- A: Using your computer or tablet, find out some information about flowers that grow in your garden.
- B: Using your computer or tablet, find our some information about your favourite minibeast.

Africa (Mathematical Development)

- A: Using a timer, count how many actions you can do in 30 seconds. You could jump, hop, write your name. Record your results.
- B: This half term we are embedding our counting skills to IO. Learn the 'IO in a bed' song and perform it for your family.

South America (Literacy Development)

- A: Draw a spring garden. Label it using the sounds you know.
- B: Retell your favourite story which includes a minibeast or the outdoors – this can be a video, picture or writing. Why is this your favourite? Which part do you like the most?

- A: Make your own magical tree. You can draw or print your tree shape and decorate using collage, paint, crayons – whatever you would like!
- B: Turn a box into your own garden scene. Be creative making different flower, plants and anything to make your garden interesting.
