



# Year 1 Spellings



## Summer 1


In Year 1 we need to practise reading and spelling a variety of 'tricky words'. These are words that are hard to sound out and need to be read and spelt by sight.

Practising these and applying them in a variety of contexts helps your child develop their vocabulary skills, accuracy and confidence.

In school, teachers will focus on these spellings below for the half term.

We will allow a variety of opportunities for children to spell these words correctly and apply to dictated sentences.

Below are a variety of examples of how you can practise these spellings at home with your child.

<p><u>Look, Say, Cover, Write, Check</u></p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Look at the word, what is the first letter? Look all the way through the word, notice word parts.</li> <li>2. Say the word. Stretch the word out.</li> <li>3. Cover the word. Spell the word – 'no peeking!'</li> <li>4. Write the word.</li> <li>5. Check if you spelled it correctly. Edit if needed.</li> </ol>	<p><u>Pyramid Words</u></p> <p>Write each of your words in a pyramid, adding a new letter each</p> 	<p><u>Rainbow Words</u></p> <p>Write your spelling words with coloured pencils. Make each letter a different colour.</p> 	<p><u>Vowel spotlight</u></p> <p>Write your spellings using one colour for the vowels and another colour for the consonants.</p> <p>(Vowels: a, e, i, o, u)</p> <p>said your all</p>		
<p><u>Keep Copying</u></p> <p>Write your words out three times each.
